

BANDING AT THE CREEK 1985

1985 has been a very good year for our Coyote Creek Riparian Station (CCRS) projects. As of October 2, there were 58 banding dates and 2623 birds banded by volunteers of the Bird Observatory. We have logged 996 recaptures which provide useful information on migration stopover times, local movements and home ranges, progress of molt, breeding and wintering site faithfulness from year to year, longevity, and more. We are grateful to Rudolph & Sletten, Inc. for the donation of a 10 x 40 foot Scotsman trailer which is used as our field office and laboratory, to the City of San Jose for access to the site, to Santa Clara Yalley Audubon Society for a donation of \$250 for bird seed and to all donors to the endowment fund. 
